

Multilingual audio books and play

'De kus van Katrijn'/'De tút fan Katryntsje'/'Katrijn's kiss'/'Der Schmatz von Gretl'.

'Touching is a Must' is the slogan used with our educational puppet theatre heritage project in a museum setting for the visually impaired and their sighted companions. In addition to our presentations of the colourful, tangible audio books, a multilingual version – in Dutch, Frisian, English and German – is available in black fabric textures and materials. This allows sighted people to experience and discover – or rather, 'see' and 'feel' – the world of darkness in which blind people live. 
